



RELATIONSHIPS

Connection with a caring adult: Connecting personally and academically on a regular basis with an advisory teacher who serves as a coach/mentor.

Connection with peers: Building relationships and sharing identities as people, as students, as community members

Engagement and Fun: Pursuing connection and wellness

Relevance: Addressing real life personal and current events/challenges that matter to students.

What are Interdisciplinary Teams?

- Teams provide a great structure for students to make additional connections within the building
- The team is comprised of an English Teacher, Science Teacher, Social Studies Teacher, and Counselor who work with a group of around 140 students

Health & Physical Education (HPE)




- Required for all students
- Students will "dress out" for class
- Students will have access to locker rooms and an HPE locker to store their belongings
- Students may utilize athletic clothing from home or choose to purchase a Thoreau HPE uniform (athletic shoes required)
- Our HPE teachers will work with students in the first weeks of school to set expectations and inform them of the steps to purchase a uniform if they select this option.
- An optional towel rental service is available for your child.

Brain Break

FCPS division-wide initiative

- 15 minute "break" during 3rd period Advisory
- Brief break from academics and opportunity for socialization
- No cell phone use during this time
- We will be surveying students to get their ideas!



Away for the Day



All electronic devices to include, but not limited to, cell phones, smart watches, tablets, personal laptops* and any other communication device must be powered off and in student backpacks upon entering the building and until the 2:15 PM dismissal.

Response to inappropriate use of electronic devices:


- 1st time- Device confiscated and brought to the front office. Student can pick up the device at the end of the school day. Staff contacts home.
- 2nd time- Device confiscated and brought to the front office. Parent/Guardian pick up required.
- 3rd time- Device confiscated and brought to the front office. Parent/Guardian pick up required. Conference will be held with AP, student and parent.



Technology

FCPSOn

- Technology used to amplify and support instruction.
- Students will be issued laptops and chargers on the first day of school.
- Highly recommend backpack with laptop pocket.
- Please follow all procedures and have a name tag visible on the laptop



Schoology



- We will not use Blackboard 24-7 Learning or BBCU
- Schoology has a connected web conferencing tool, Zoom
- Schoology works with Google Drive
- You will need a <u>SIS/ParentVUE account</u> to login to Schoology
- Parent accounts will be available mid-August
- Students can <u>log in</u> using their FCPS student ID and password.
 - Students will not see any classes until the grading period starts
- As a parent or guardian, you will be able to use Schoology to view: your child's class, assignments and participation, calendar, teacher comments, scores, and feedback

Health and Safety Updates







Updates to the <u>Health and Safety Guidance Document</u> have been made in accordance with new guidance provided by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Virginia Department of Health (VDH), the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE), and the Fairfax County Health Department (FCHD).

Key updates include:

- Universal masking for fully vaccinated and not fully vaccinated staff, students, and visitors
- Physical distancing changes due to the prioritized need to offer in-person instruction to all students
- Layered prevention strategies situation specific
- Parental Guardian Health Screening Commitment Form discontinued

FCPS Layered Prevention Strategies

- All students, unvaccinated staff, staff, faculty and visitors wear face coverings while indoors on school property (to include the buildings, school buses and other school-provided vehicles)
- Students will be able to remove their masks at lunch while eating, but will put them back on when they are finished.
- Bus/van passengers and staff MUST wear masks.
- Students and staff are not required to wear masks outdoors.
- One of the most important prevention strategies guidelines is screening students daily for any signs of illness prior to leaving home for school. Any student who is ill or presents with COVID-like symptoms is to remain at home.
- Measures will be implemented to ensure that common areas and equipment, and personal workspaces, are regularly cleaned and sanitized.



Protocols for Potential Temporary COVID-19 Closure



In-Person Closure Type	Threshold to Initiate In-Person Closure	Student Support During Closure
Individual Student(s)	Student(s) is directed by their health provider or local health department to quarantine or isolate; or FCPS is directed by the local health department to pause a student's access to inperson instruction while contact tracing is implemented as a matter of public health, but their school and class remain open for all other students. AND The student's school and class remain open for all other students	Students will complete asynchronous assignments made by their teacher(s). Assignments will be accessed through the Learning Management System (e.g. Schoology) or be available for pick up at the school.
Individual Teacher	Teacher is directed by their health provider or local health department to quarantine or isolate; or FCPS is directed by the local health department to pause a teacher's access to inperson teaching while contact tracing is implemented as a matter of public health; AND The teacher's school and class remain open for students.	Schools will secure a substitute / alternate coverage for continuity of inperson instruction for the teacher's class(es).

Protocols for Potential Temporary COVID-19 Closure (contd.)



Class	FCPS is directed by the local health department to temporarily close the class as a matter of public health while contact tracing and case investigation is conducted, respond to an outbreak, or to address other health matters	All students and staff in the impacted class will transition to synchronous virtual learning for that class (period for secondary students) until the class can reopen. During such time, secondary students in the impacted class would access work for their other classes via asynchronous assignments made by their teacher(s). Assignments will be accessed through the Learning Management System (e.g. Schoology) or be available for pick up at the school.
School	FCPS is directed by the local health department to temporarily close the entire class as a matter of public health to conduct contact tracing and case investigation, respond to an outbreak, or address other public health matters.	All students and staff at the school will transition to synchronous virtual learning to ensure continuity of learning until in-person instruction can resume
Division	FCPS is directed by the local or state health officials, or Executive Order to temporarily close the division as a matter of public health.	All students and staff will transition to synchronous virtual learning to ensure continuity of learning until in-person instruction can resume. All students already have access to the technology should this transition be needed.

Cafeteria & Meals

- Free breakfast and full lunch service including hot lunches for all students
- Students may not arrive earlier than 7:10 AM.
 Students may pick up breakfast from the cafeteria "grab and go."
- A la carte items will be phased in-MySchoolBucks
- Vending machines will be phased in
- We have seating for 450 students but each lunch has approximately 300 students assigned
- Masks are required, except when eating



Health...what ifs?

- Ongoing communication from FCPS Check the webpage!
- Focused on Returning Strong Remaining Open
- Rely on Layered Prevention Strategies
- Per Governor's Order Five Days of in-person instruction
- Any need for closure will be directed by the State and Local Health Department or Executive Order
- Schools, teachers and students will be prepared for virtual environment IF needed
- Zoom and Schoology

- 7th Grade Immunization Requirement
 - All students entering 7th grade are required to receive one dose of each of the following immunizations prior to the beginning of school: Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis booster (Tdap), and Meningococcal vaccine (MenACWY).

- September 20th: First day of after-school activities and late buses
- Club/activity information will be posted on Schoology in the coming weeks

Late Bus Information

- Late buses are provided on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays.
 - Parent pick-up or walking home is required for Tuesday and Friday activities (no later than 4:15pm.)
- Late buses will depart Thoreau at *approximately* 4:30-5:00 pm. *Times are subject to change.*
- Late bus runs differ from the morning and afternoon runs. There are fewer buses and stops. Late bus runs will be posted in the front lobby, by the cafeteria, and on Schoology.
