 Pacing Students should be ready to learn at a faster pace. Content is organized to allow for going deeper in application. IS HONORS FOR ME/MY STUDENT?	Key differences: Honors vs. standard
 Are you ready to Craft essays, stories, and analytical responses? Engage in thoughtful discussions about the texts that you read? This can include forming and defending your own opinions, considering multiple perspectives, and asking probing questions. Dive into the deeper meaning of texts, looking beyond surface-level plot points to explore symbolism, themes, and author intent? Take initiative in your learning, whether through researching topics of interest, completing independent research, or working on long-term projects? 	 Both Standard and Honors level courses will offer challenging, rigorous learning opportunities for students. Standard courses will offer more *scaffolds to support student learning. In Honors level classes, students will have additional opportunities to extend their learning beyond the standard level curriculum In Standard level classes, students will benefit from a slower pace and more guided structures *Scaffolding: Temporary supports used to make learning more accessible and promote student success. Like training wheels, these supports are gradually removed as students gain proficiency.
